<code><style></code>	Tells your browser you are using CSS
<pre>ul { list-style-type: none; margin: 0; padding: 0; overflow: hidden; background-color: black; }</pre>	This section is for the navigation bar
<pre>li { float: left; }</pre>	<p>This is where the links go on the navigation bar (Li means list)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You can choose the links to be on the left or right
<pre>li a, .navigationbarsection { display: inline-block; color: white; text-align: left; padding: 14px 16px; text-decoration: none; font-family: Arial, Helvetica, sans-serif; font-weight: bold; }</pre>	<p>This is the 'section' or 'category' on the navigation bar before you hover over it</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Changing the color will change the colour of the text You need the padding to give a space to the left and right of the word and it is measured in pixels Text decoration could be underline but it does not look very nice! Font Family is where the font used in the order given Font Weight could be normal or bold
<pre>li a:hover, .navigationbar:hover .navigationbarsection { background-color: blue;} </pre>	<p>This is about what happens when you hover over the navigation bar</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You can change the colour of the 'highlight'
<pre>li.navigationbar { display: inline-block; }</pre>	<p>This part is how the dropdown will appear</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Keep this as an inline block
<pre>.navigationbar-dropdown { display: none; position: absolute; background-color: blue; min-width: 160px; box-shadow: 0px 8px 16px 0px rgba(0,0,0,0.2); }</pre>	<p>This is section is about what the dropdown part will look like</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You could change the background color of the highlight You could tweak the min-width to adjust the width of the dropdown part You could add a box-shadow if you want the edge to stand out more If you don't like the shadow you could delete the line and use border-style: solid; instead
<pre>.navigationbar-dropdown a { color: white; padding: 12px 16px; text-decoration: none; display: block; text-align: left; font-family: Arial, Helvetica, sans-serif; font-weight: bold; }</pre>	<p>This section is about the colour of the hyperlinks on the dropdown part of the navigation bar</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> You need the padding to give a space to the left and right of the word and it is measured in pixels Text decoration could be underline but it does not look very nice! Font Family is where the font used in the order given Font Weight could be normal or bold
<pre>.navigationbar-dropdown a:hover {background-color: white}</pre>	This section is the colour that highlights over the dropdown menu item your mouse is hovering over
<pre>.navigationbar:hover .navigationbar-dropdown { display: block; }</pre>	This section displays the highlight as a block of colour
<code></style></code>	This is what you put at the end of your CSS code

What the HTML means (all of which should be in the <BODY> section of your website)

	This is the tag for an unordered (bulleted) list
HOME	This is the first menu item called HOME for the navigation bar – it has a hyperlink to index.html <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You can change the href to a different page or website • You can change the text between > and with what you want the menu to say
This goes to Google but has no dropdown	This is the next menu item and is just a hyperlink with n dropdown menu <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You can change the href to a different page or website • You can change the text between > and with what you want the menu to say
<div class="navigationbar-dropdown"> Google Bing	This is a dropdown menu where the first link does nothing (as it is the 'section') there are hyperlinks in a dropdown menu when you hover over the section <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You can change the href to a different page or website • You can change the text between > and with what you want the menu to say
<li class="navigationbar"> This is a link as are the links below <div class="navigationbar-dropdown"> Google Bing </div> 	This is a dropdown menu where the 'section' is a hyperlink and there are hyperlinks in a dropdown menu when you hover over the section <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • You can change the href to a different page or website • You can change the text between > and with what you want the menu to say
	This ends the unordered list
